

Angus Dun, Episcopal Bishop Of Washington, 1944-62, Dead

***A Liberal, He Was a Leading
Church Envoy and Active
in Ecumenical Work***

WASHINGTON, Aug. 12 — The Right Rev. Angus Dun, who as Episcopal Bishop of Washington from 1944 to 1962, officiated at many national ceremonies, including the funeral service for President Franklin D. Roosevelt, died today of a stroke. He was 79 years old and had been sick since March.

Surviving are his widow, the former Catherine Whipple Pew; two sons, the Rev. Angus Dun Jr. of Grenbrae, Calif., and Dr. Alan A. Dun of Farmington, Conn.; eight grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.

The funeral will be held in Washington Cathedral, his official seat as bishop.
