
MISS LAWRENCE WEDS DR. SLATTERY

Daughter of Bishop of Massa-
chusetts Episcopal Diocese
Marries Bishop Coadjutor.

IN ST. PAUL'S CATHEDRAL

Bride's Father One of Officiating
Clergy—Bridegroom Former Rec-
tor of Grace Church, New York.

BOSTON, Nov. 19.—Miss Sarah Law-
rence, daughter of Bishop William Law-
rence of the Massachusetts Episcopal
diocese, was married today to the Right
Rev. Charles L. Slattery, Bishop Coad-
jutor of the diocese. The ceremony oc-
curred in St. Paul's Cathedral, with
Bishop Lawrence and Dean Edmund S.
Rousmaniere of the Cathedral officiat-
ing. Only near relatives were present.

Bishop Slattery was rector of Grace
Episcopal Church on Broadway at
Tenth Street for twelve years, before he
was elected to the Episcopate a year ago.
On his next birthday, Dec. 9, he will be
56 years old. Prior to his engagement,
which was just announced on Nov. 5,
his friends had considered him a con-
firmed bachelor.

The bride, who has made her home
with her parents at 122 Commonwealth
Avenue, in Boston, is the sister of Mrs.
Harold Peabody of Boston, Mrs. Morton
L. Feary and Mrs. Lansing P. Reed of
this city, Mrs. Lewis H. Mills of Port-
land, Ore, the Rev. William Appleton
Lawrence, rector of St. Stephen's
Church in Lynn, Mass., and Frederick
C. Lawrence, now a student at the
Episcopal Theological School in Cam-
bridge.

She has been a trustee of Wellesley
College and of the Wrentham State
School. She is a graduate of the Sim-
mons College School of Social Work and
is a Director of the Family Welfare So-
ciety and of the Lincoln House. During
the war she served in the Volunteer Ser-
vice Bureau of the Boston Red Cross.
She was for four years President of the
Junior League, and is also a member of
the Women's City Club.
