Dear People of Saint Andrew's,

Please note that in June our schedule of Sunday services changes. First, on June 10<sup>th</sup> there will be one service at 9 am, followed by our Outreach Fair (see article) and then on the last Sunday, June 24<sup>th</sup>, we will begin our 9 o'clock summer schedule through September 2<sup>nd</sup>. On June 3<sup>rd</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>, we will adhere to our 8 and 10 am schedule. It is always a little difficult to shift from the familiar pattern, but please take note: two Sundays at 8 and 10 am and 2 at 9 am.

I went with some of our youth and adults to a "U2charist" in April at St. Andrew's in Framingham, where we experienced a service using Bono's music to draw the attention of our Deanery parishes to the cause of world poverty and how the UN's Millennium Goals can help achieve the eradication of extreme poverty. Jesus calls us to remember that as we have served others in need, we serve him. For a very little portion of the amount we regularly spend in the First World all the time, a great deal can be accomplished in the Third World. While the music of Bono was meant to draw people to that Sunday evening service, the purpose was to focus us on Bono's passion for God's

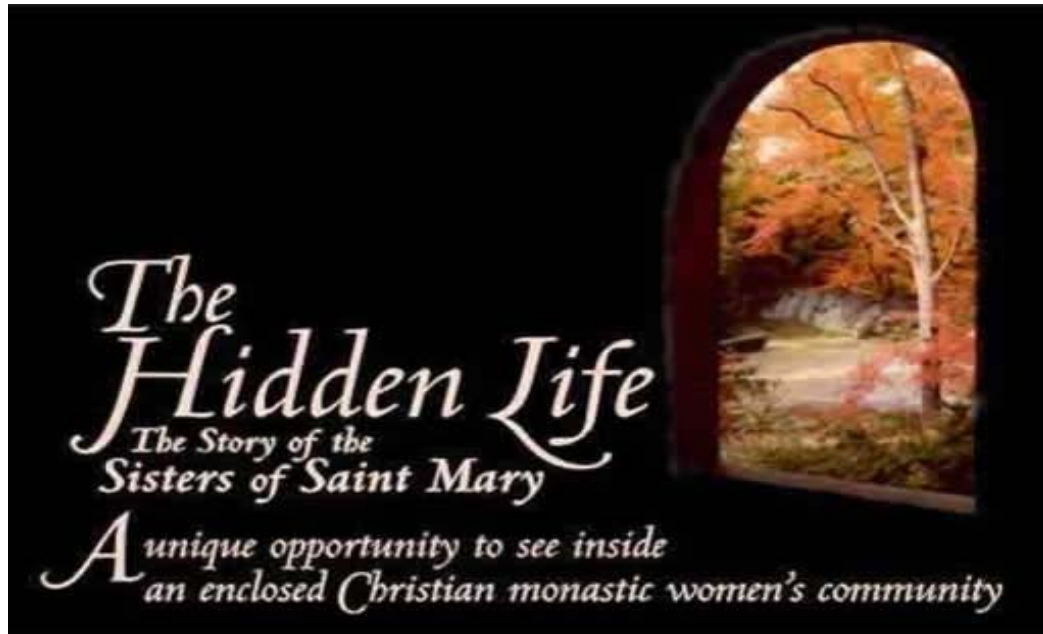

## Vestry Meeting Highlights ~ March 2007

### A HIDDEN LIFE

On Tuesday, June 12<sup>th</sup>, we will be graced by the presence of Mother Miriam of the Episcopal Sisters of St. Mary, Greenwich, NY, who will speak and show the documentary made by PBS about their cloistered life. As on other “movie nights,” we will begin with a potluck supper at 6 pm, with the presentation to follow at 7. This is the oldest religious order for women in the United States. You’ll be surprised how accomplished these women are and what they have done through the years and are doing now.



- ✘ **Priest-in-Residence Report:** 250 people attended Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday services. We had a successful Lenten Series, and will be continuing the movie series (due to gift of projector and screen). Ascension Day Eucharist to be held at St. Andrews on May 17<sup>th</sup> sponsored by tri parish committee (St. Andrew’s, Trinity Chapel in Shirley and St. David’s in Pepperell). This will be the first event we have done together. Fr. Alan is teaching a confirmation class on Sunday mornings.
- ✘ **Treasurer’s Report/Investment Report:** List of in-kind gifts given over last few months to be included in next X-Press. Dwight suggested organizing parishioner pledges to offset church expenses. Dick suggested that Commission chairs send a wish list of items needed to Sue for publication in the X-Press. Fr. Alan has plans to purchase a new sanctuary light. Sue distributed a Balance Sheet and Statement of Financial Activities which will be included in the Treasurer’s Report on a quarterly basis.
- ✘ **Old Business**
- ✘ **Directory**—Has been completed and distributed to some parishioners at Sunday services. If necessary, those remaining will be mailed. Vestry thanks Carolyn Smith for her donation of time and money and John Ferrillo for his photographic skill.
- ✘ **Access Ramp**—Manny e-mailed vestry members of his suggestion to hire Nick Potitis for the ramp contractor. Manny wrote that he is no longer able to be project manager due to job responsibilities. It is unclear whether a handicap accessible door is part of the bid. Linda to contact Manny regarding this question as well as asking for a copy of the building permit. Motion approved to authorize Manny to request a letter contract and a price list of materials (that will be deducted from the bottom line if the church can procure the materials for substantially less) from Nick and present it to the vestry for approval.
- ✘ **Vestry Retreat**—After much discussion, it was decided to plan a one-day retreat at a local venue (possibly Church of Good Shepherd in Acton or Clinton) for June 16<sup>th</sup> and to consider a weekend retreat (possibly at Emery House) for next February or March (after Annual Meeting).
- ✘ **Commission Roster Update**—Dick has updated the website with the new members of each commission.
- ✘ **Commission Reports**
- ✘ **Membership (Dick)** — Church sign designs have been received and will be reviewed at next commission meeting before being brought before the vestry for input.
- ✘ **Outreach**—Recommendation for appropriation of funds (totaling \$11,150 of a \$12,000 budget). Episcopal Relief and Development \$2,000; Young Life \$2500; South American Missionary Society \$1500; Habitat for Humanity \$1500; Loaves and Fishes \$1500; Our Prison Neighbors \$250; Diocese of Tanga in Tanzania \$1000; Bishop Shaw’s Charities \$150; Refugee Immigration \$150; Battered Women’s Rescue \$250; Episcopal City Mission \$200; Massachusetts Council of Churches \$100 (Membership donation). Also considering a donation to the Esperanza Academy in Lawrence (decision pending visit to the school for underprivileged girls). Motion voted to accept recommendations of Outreach Commission. Mission Outreach Sunday (June 10<sup>th</sup>); Fair to be held in Parish Hall for recipients to present the work done by their organizations.

## Vestry Meeting Highlights ~ continued

- ✘ Pastoral Care—John related through an e-mail that another LEMBE is needed to handle Sunday communion visits to those parishioners unable to attend church. Fr. Alan is happy to take communion to homebound parishioners.
- ✘ Stewardship—Made \$380 at Palm Sunday mini-fair. Insurance review had been a part of Stewardship when Al Colburn was chairperson but has not been handled by Stewardship for the last five years. Sue to put a Help Wanted request in the X-Press for someone with insurance expertise willing to take over that review.
- ✘ Worship Commission—Fr. Alan and Michael Smith plan to provide training for new lectors and chalice bearers. They will be encouraging the children to write the “Prayers of the People” read during youth services. Fr. Alan would be happy to have children do readings during normal “adult” services.
- ✘ Parish Historian—Dick Dabrowski and Louise Rogers appointed to the executive board of the Parish Historian Society (includes 194 parishes). 2008 annual meeting of the society to be held at St. Andrew's in April or May 2008.
- ✘ New Business
- ✘ Motion approved to allow the inclusion of any amended reports of the 2007 Annual Meeting to be included as attachments to the Annual Meeting minutes.
- ✘ Rectory rental—Current tenant has given notice effective as of 5/15/07. Sue suggested that the \$3500 average annual heating cost be listed with the monthly rental (currently \$1350) when advertising for a tenant. Dwight suggested that we consider using the rectory as an opportunity for outreach. Sub-committee formed (Fr. Alan, Dwight, Jeanne and Linda) to explore the possibilities

## HERE'S JACKIE

Jackie Strobel has had a somewhat unusual life in that she spent 25 years of it as a member of the Community of Jesus on Cape Cod, an ecumenical Christian community founded in the late 1960's. It's quite a story because she wasn't a nun. In fact, she had been married for 13 years and had 3 children when her first husband died. She remarried and had another son before she felt "called" to enter this community and live in a house there with her family and other people from time to time to model the Christian faith to them. She was a Congregationalist, living in Lancaster, when her pastor at the time became interested in the Community of Jesus and encouraged her to make the move, and he later followed with his wife.



There was a sense of security "living in the Light" at the Community, and Jackie was busy working for a doctor there, helping in ministry and prayer, and later helping care for elder members as well as working with their publishing arm, The Paraclete Press. Music was always an important part of their lives and is even a more prominent outreach now, the Gloria Dei.

As you can tell by her accent, Jackie is a Massachusetts girl, born in Somerville and growing up around the Boston area, attending high school in Melrose. She married young and her mother died shortly after that. And her life unfolded as described above. She says, "The Community of Jesus helped me to lean on God through Jesus; the experience was great."

However, just as she felt called to go into the Community, Jackie also felt called to leave it a few years ago, not entirely sure what she would do next. Her marriage ended and she decided to move to this area. "Now," she says, "I thank God for leading me back to be near one of my sons and family and to have found a wonderful church family."
